


Corporate Parenting National Training Program

- We delivered in 29 out of the 32 local authorities
- 11 out of the 14 NHS Health Boards
- Various other settings events, conferences etc.
- Involved over 150 looked after young people across
 Scotland in the sessions
- Delivered training inputs to over 2000 'corporate parents' during the 3 years of our funding







- Recommendations will be put to Social Care &Well-being committee for Elected members to make decisions in relation to the future model for residential children's services.
- Strengthening of Family Firm internally and building the network of placements with community planning partners which includes private sector.
- Working in partnership with Who Cares? Scotland to seek to develop a bid for one
 of the six Demonstrator Sites to ensure transformational change in Throughcare
 Services (The Life Changes Trust National Lottery).
- Developing an online Corporate Parenting Course for all staff
- Seeking approval for the establishment of the Corporate Parenting Champions Board

- Continue to support young people into independent living including suitable housing
